Please respect the easement or right-of-way by not placing obstructions or encroachments within the right-of-way.

SUGAR CITY CEMETERY: Those visiting the Sugar Salem Moody Cemetery will need to enter and exit through the south entrance. The west entrance is closed due to the installation of a new sprinkler system. The entire project may take a year to complete. We are sorry for any inconvenience. PLEASE DO NOT DRIVE OVER ANY PIPES and use only those roads without pipes crossing them. The system costs about

\$16,000 and we hope visitors will use every precaution to avoid any damage.
